



## *Pathways to Degree Programs*

### *Leavell College*

The Thrive and Thrive+ classes are fully accredited and receive Leavell College credit. Therefore, the hours can be transferred directly into any Bachelor's degree program as free elective credit hours, for up to a total of 12 credit hours:

- 8 Thrive classes: 8 hours credit
- 4 Thrive + classes: 4 hours credit

However, the classes can also be counted for credit in the Ministry to Women major:

- 2 to 6 free elective hours

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<sup>1</sup> These hours count towards Accelerated program credit allotment. Students in an MA program are allowed 9 total credits, and MDiv students are allowed 27 total credits from the Accelerated program.
